Joint Resolution

Waiving certain enrollment requirements with respect to any appropriation bill for the remainder of the One Hundred Second Congress.

1 USC 106 note.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the provisions of sections 106 and 107 of title 1, United States Code, are waived with respect to the printing (on parchment or otherwise) of the enrollment of any appropriation bill of the One Hundred Second Congress hereafter to be presented to the President. Such an enrollment shall be in such form as the Committee on House Administration of the House of Representatives certifies to be a true enrollment. As used in this resolution, the term "appropriation bill" means a bill or joint resolution making or continuing appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1993.
